LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the end of this workshop participants will be able to:

- Identify the unique features of Central Australian context: demographic, historical, political and environmental
- Identify principles of intercultural communication
- Identify key elements of Aboriginal cultures, specifically kinship, language, worldview and identity, and diversity within and between cultures
- Describe how the social determinants impact on the health and well-being of individuals and groups
- Identify local Indigenous organisations within Central Australia including the support available from Aboriginal colleagues (Aboriginal Liaison Officers, Aboriginal Health Practitioners, Aboriginal Community Workers) and other key resource people
- Recognise the stages of culture shock and how to respond to them
